



The Joyful Noise

By the time this newsletter arrives in your home, most schoolchildren will have been on vacation for several weeks. Depending on employment opportunities, college kids may be hanging around home more than they ever intended too. Cries of “I’m SO borred!” will be ringing in parents’ ears.

Ahh! The lazy days of summer! We long for them all winter and spring. But perhaps we should be careful what we ask for.

Keeping a child stimulated for a couple of months is nearly impossible. Vacation Bible School and summer camps might break the monotony for a while, but really, how many trips to the mall, the movies or the Dells can a family afford? After a while, those get to be old hat too.

Richard Louv, author of *Last Child in the Woods*, points out that boredom can be bad or good. At its worst, it leads to destructive behavior and passive activities that don’t truly engage the mind.

At its best, however, boredom fosters creativity. Imagine Sir Isaac Newton daydreaming under an apple tree when a piece of fruit fell to the ground beside him. Our understanding of the world was transformed by that moment of idleness.

In medieval times, boredom was called “acedia” – a dangerous form of spiritual alienation that devalued the world and its creator. It was considered a sin. In the era of plagues and famine, the failure to engage fully in the world was life-threatening.

But in our age, when our needs for food, shelter and medical care are mostly met, and when cell phones put texting, video games and online movies in our pockets, the more frightening possibility is that we never slow down and never think for ourselves. In such an environment, *constructive* boredom can lead a child (or adult!) to pick up a book, build a fort, pull out crayons and paper, or just sit in the shade feeling the wind on one’s face. And sometimes, when a child says, “I’m bored,” what she really wants isn’t an activity but some interaction – relationship building – with an adult.

I suspect that boredom is related to God’s creation of the day of Sabbath rest. While God saw that all the days of creation were “good,” only the Sabbath is “blessed.” It’s God’s way of telling us that we all need some down time. Creation and creativity depends on it. When we treat it like that, occasional bouts of boredom aren’t a sin at all, but a blessing.

Coming to worship on Sunday is one way we people of faith turn away from the constant hubbub around us. Is it boring? Sometimes. But retreating to a sanctuary even for an hour a week allows us to notice things that would otherwise get crowded out. A family picnic, without cell phones or other distractions can serve the same purpose. I’m sure you’ll come up with other ways to be creatively bored – with others or alone.

I encourage you therefore to allow yourself to be bored once in a while over these next two months. God visited Jacob in a dream at Bethel (Genesis 28) in just such a moment. How might God visit you in a quiet and unguarded moment this summer?

Session Meeting Notes - May 23, 2011

The Session of Wauwatosa Presbyterian Church met on May 23, 2011 at 7:00 p.m. and the following committees presented reports:

Adult Enrichment

In planning for adult enrichment the committee considers the categories of knowledge of Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit, the Bible, understanding of discipleship, history and theology and spiritual formation. The Sunday morning education classes and Wonderful Wednesday programs have been successfully completed and work is being done for the fall and winter programs.

Nominating Committee

To date, nominees for 3 deacon positions (including youth deacon), Youth Elder and Elder for Christian Education, have accepted the call to serve.

Personnel – The committee's concerns for the immediate future are finding Bonnie's successor, supporting Pastor Jim during the period when we will have no ad-

ditional professional pastoral staff, and finding funds to compensate the Church's staff, who have not received raises for several years. A longer term goal is to keep the office technologically up to date, helping the staff with database and web site management, given the need and expectation for electronic communications.

The following actions were taken by Session:

1. **Worship** – Approved the baptisms of Andrew Guckenberger, Mable Jane Obermyer, Olivia and James Johnson, and Erin Moloney.
2. **Membership** – Approved changes to the membership rolls and reinstated one member to the Active List.
3. **Finance** – Approved the receipt of a bequest from the estate of Betty Crawford for \$55,436.80.
4. **Personnel** – Approved the Session amend the personnel committee budget to use funds from the Betty Crawford legacy for employee compensation and the pastor's sabbatical fund.
5. **Memorial** – Accepted the donation of a sitting stone for the Memorial Garden and authorized expending up to \$200 for its delivery.



The Membership Committee has decided to suspend the production of the office generated picture directory. Instead, in honor of WPC's 85th anniversary next year, we will work with Olan Mills to create a special picture directory that will come out in 2012. Photos will be taken at the church this August - October. Watch for more information coming soon! **Note: This summer, the office will distribute a thin, photo-less directory.**




