What sort of feeling do I want visitors to have when they walk in the building the first time and take a look around? How important is the music we offer in worship to God (not only for me, but for others)? And would this church be preparing for its 85<sup>th</sup> anniversary in a few months if not for the foresight, dedication, sacrifice, and generosity of generations like me?

Your stewardship commitment can help this church raise up effective leaders, faithfully answer the call of Jesus Christ, and be strong for years to come. To learn more, please ...

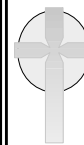

## Session Meeting Notes - August 22, 2011

The Session of Wauwatosa Presbyterian Church met at the church for its regular meeting on August 22, 2011 at 7:00 p.m.

### Committee Reports:

#### **Membership:**

Using grant money from Milwaukee Presbytery to improve the church's website, Elder Pam Parker reviewed our new website with the Session and said it should be available in the very near future. (*The website went live on September 1st*)

#### **Christian Ed:**

"Seasons of the Spirit" has been chosen as the new curriculum for Church School. A new class will be added, in order to ensure good class participation. The intergenerational Wonderful Wednesdays in Advent are scheduled for November 30<sup>th</sup>, December 7<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup>.

### Session Actions:

- Approved major Building and Grounds projects to be paid out of the bequest from the estate of Betty Crawford – new heating unit in the south foyer, new ductwork over the office, replace the air handler in the gathering space, replace the 20 year old air conditioner.
- Approved cash donations as an option in lieu of food and/or clothing for special mission projects.
- Approved the allocation of a special gift of \$3,000, to this year's available scholarship amounts.
- Approved a gift of \$1000 allocated to the 2011 Mission budget. This gift was in honor of Margaret Morris from her daughter.
- Dissolved the Designated Associate Pastor Nominating Committee with thanks for their diligent work.

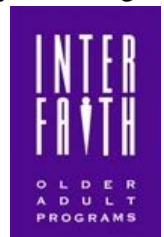

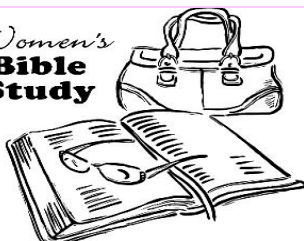
## **October Adult Education offers up opportunity to consider:**

## **Formation Corner** by Laura Loving, Associate Pastor

What is **spiritual formation**? To some it may sound suspiciously vague, like a collection of clouds. To others it may sound slightly painful, something akin to a dental impressions mold. Let's see what the PCUSA has to say about it. The denominational website offers this definition:

*Spiritual formation is the activity of the Holy Spirit which molds our lives into the likeness of Jesus Christ. This likeness is one of deep intimacy with God and genuine compassion for all of creation. The Spirit works not only in the lives of individuals but also in the church, shaping it into the Body of Christ. We cooperate with this work of the Spirit through certain practices that make us more open and responsive to the Spirit's touch, disciplines such as sabbath keeping, works of compassion and justice, discernment, worship, hospitality, spiritual friendships, and contemplative silence.*

**Office of Spiritual Formation, Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.)**

As your new Associate Pastor, I will offer an ongoing conversation in the newsletter and other venues to explore spiritual formation together in the days ahead. Already, the warm welcome you have provided for me here constitutes a form of spiritual discipline, that of hospitality. You may recognize the saying that whenever we welcome a stranger, we may be entertaining Christ, unaware. As we honor the Christ light in one another, we act as people who take the metaphorical bushel off our light and let the world see God's glory and compassion. 










### **RETIREMENT:**

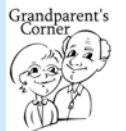

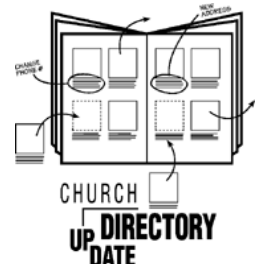

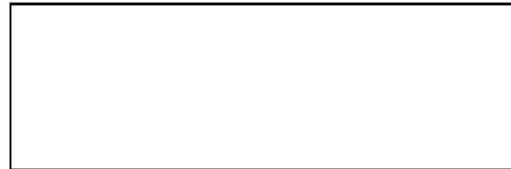
